Tunesmith NightSaturday February 9

Our monthly songwriter showcase continues on Saturday, February 9, 2013 at 7:00 pm at Lear's Main Street Grill in Enterprise. This month features songwriters Carolyn Lochert, Sloan Martin and Ryan Rebo. Carolyn Lochert's jazzy vocals and bluesy

groove express her songs that reach from fun-loving heights to the deepest of blue. Her career has led from her third grade debut role as Head Lettuce in Peter Rabbit, to music studies with an emphasis in jazz composition, with Portland trumpeter and composer Rob Blakeslee. After teaching voice for four years, she sang in several jazz combos including the Tone Sharks. Lochert will be accompanied by guitarist **Darrell Brann** for this Tunesmith Night performance.

From Portland, Oregon, **Sloan Martin** started out as a drummer but was drawn to the power of the classic songwriters of the late 60's and 70's: Young, Dylan, Townes Van Zandt, the Boss; and then to his contemporaries like Justin Vernon, Tallest Man On Earth, Ryan Adams, Patty Griffin. In moving to guitar, he was able to fuse his love for rhythm with the melodies drifting thru his head, and also his love for literature and poetry. His songs started out inspired by the bluegrass music of his home state of Kentucky, then drifted to alt.country, then back to rock and roll where it all started. Martin says of his writing, "Now the tunes just come as they are, its not up to me, I just have to catch them!"

Seattle born/Montana raised musician ${\bf Ryan}~{\bf Rebo}$ has been writing and recording a wide variety of music for the last decade. He pulls


Dulcimer Week 2013

Dulcimer Week in the Wallowas registration is now open! Our third annual, week-

long mountain dulcimer camp will be held **June 30-July 6** at Wallowa Lake, with top nationally-known instructors. Teaching intermediate and advanced students is **Aaron O'Rourke** from Tallahassee, FL, the **2010 National Mountain Dulcimer Champion. Dave Haas** from Cross Lanes, WV, a well-established instructor back east, will teach intermediate and advanced beginner classes. Check out their videos on YouTube! **Heidi Muller** and **Bob Webb**, who host this camp, will teach lower level classes including complete beginners. We add elective classes, concerts, jams and time off to explore the area to make this a very popular camp that drew people from eight states last year. Local residents can also attend as commuters. Aaron O'Rourke is an outstanding musician, instructor and composer who can play anything from Celtic airs to jazz and swing tunes cleanly and expressively, with lightning speed when it's called for. Discovering the dulcimer in 2003 when he played in a punk band, he went on to become the 2010 National Mountain Dulcimer Champion at Winfield, KS. He also plays guitar and banjammer (banjo-dulcimer), has recorded CDs both solo and with his group, the Aaron O'Rourke Trio, and has


Held at the Wallowa School in Wallowa, Oregon from **July 7-12, 2013**, Wallowa Fiddle Tunes Camp is a week-long, small, inexpensive and family oriented music workshop focused on traditional string instruments, begun in 2005.

Besides basic music instruction on specific instruments, the camp also teaches students how to jam, and promotes their skills in dance fiddling by providing opportunities to support the in-house dance instruction. Class instructors also collaborate curriculum among the different instruments. Evening events include jam sessions, concerts and dances, with some events open to the public, including the

popular Thursday evening community dance backed by faculty and student musicians. Fee for the week-long camp is \$100 per person, with a discount offered for families of four or more. Classes are held in the elementary wing of the Wallowa School, **core classes from 9 AM until noon, and electives in the afternoon, Monday through Friday.** There is plenty of time for practice and jam sessions. Free camping is provided on the school grounds, and a nutritious catered lunch is available Monday through Friday.

Registration for Fiddle Camp opens on **March 1** and is available online at www.wvmusicalliance.org along with much more information about this great family program. Many classes fill to capacity quickly, so have a look at the list of instructors below and get ready to fiddle!


