Dear Wallowa Fiddle Tunes Campers,

This welcome letter gives you some basics as you make preparations for camp. Hard copies of this letter will be available at check in, Sunday, July 7th, starting at 3 pm.

Afternoon electives are offered Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday. They are subject to change, depending on what faculty and campers decide to share with each other. These electives are a great opportunity to practice a second instrument, so consider bringing more than one instrument. I hear there may be a penny whistle elective offered.

The Wallowa School District has requested that we have no alcohol, drugs, campfires or firearms on school property. Dogs are welcome on the grounds, and must remain on a leash and be cleaned up after. The school dumpster on the north side of the building is available for camper garbage, but plan to carry home your recyclables. No cars are allowed to drive into the playground area for unloading at this time. There is plenty of street parking or spots in the lots on the north side of the building.

Quiet hours are 11 pm until 7 am.

You are welcome to tent camp on the grassy south side of the school, which is also near the school playground. Another option is to park an RV/van in the parking lots on the north side of the school. This is dry camping.

Items you might consider bringing: armless chairs, folding table, camp stove, cooler (ice is available to buy at the corner market) headlamp, bug repellent, sunscreen and hat, rain jacket, awning or canopy for shade and weather protection, extra blanket and sleeping bag, garbage bags (for storing items if it rains), drinking water storage container, ear plugs, recording device, extra instrument strings, small bills (for ice, coffee, snacks, CD's), and lawn games.

School showers are available this year in the new gym - with HOT water. Please respect the school and only enter the new gym building for shower and bathroom use. The gym showers/bathrooms will be open 7 am - 9 pm. The bathrooms across from the cafeteria/Beth Johnson Room are open 24 hours a day. The classrooms are now equipped with air conditioning and the cafeteria/Beth Johnson Room will have a swamp cooler going.

Mike with Burns Violins (burnsviolins.com) will be offering repairs and sales again this year. Duane Boyer will have a few guitars available to use for the week, for those who have a friend or family member who might be interested in signing up for the beginning guitar class on last minute notice.

The new Wallowa Bike Park is on the north side of the school and provides another play space to families. It is sandwiched between the parking lots that we will use for parking and RV camping.

Construction is ongoing at the Wallowa school so be respectful and patient with the construction workers and their required noise and things. There will be new grass plantings to stay off of.

Remember you can pre-purchase lunch through the camp registration website. Lunch is Monday - Friday (Z's BBQ will cater, \$80), and you are on your own for breakfast and dinner.
